

Week 3: Sacred Purpose PRACTICE

Day 1 (Sunday) - Spiritual Gifts (Part 1)

Read these passages about spiritual gifts:

1 Corinthians 12:4-13

1 Corinthians 4:25-30

Romans 12:4-8

Ephesians 4:11-16

1 Peter 4:10-11

What do you notice?

How do these texts affect your living?

What gift(s) do you bring to the body of Christ?

How do you currently offer your gifts in the context of the church?

Day 2 (Monday) - Spiritual Gifts (Part 2)

Fill out the Spiritual Gifts Questionnaire (attached). What is your reaction to the results? How do you envision using your gift(s) for the building up of the Body of Christ?

Day 3 (Tuesday) - Created with Purpose (Part 1)

Read Psalm 139:13-16

Name at least 5 things this passage says about you.

Read Jeremiah 1:4-5

What was the work Jeremiah was called to?

Day 4 (Wednesday) - Created with Purpose (Part 2)

Read Galatians 1:5-7

Like Paul, you are "set apart" for God's work. In what way(s) can you embrace this concept in your own life?

Read Galatians 5:22-25

Consider the fruits of the spirit Paul names. Where do you see those traits in your own life? How are you "bearing fruit" in your service to God and others?

Day 5 (Thursday) - Calling (Part 1)

Read Genesis 12:1-9

What did you notice about Abraham's story? Do you believe that God can call **you** at any age, at any stage of your life?

Day 6 (Friday) - Calling (Part 2)

Read 1 Samuel 3:1-11

Where might you need help in discerning whether it is God's voice that you are hearing? Who might be your "Eli"—someone who can listen with you? Consider asking that person to help you discern God's voice in this season of your life. What new thing might God be calling you to do?

Day 7 (Saturday) - Possibilities

If you are currently serving in the church in some capacity, what do you love about it? Take time to consider at least two other possible areas of ministry that connect your passion and gifts. Pursue information online or with other resources and make a list of possible places of involvement. Don't overlook informal opportunities involving family, friends, or your workplace or neighborhood. Choose one place where you will commit to explore how to get involved.

Spiritual Gifts Assessment

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

-1 Peter 4:10

God has blessed all of us with many gifts and talents.

Some of us are skilled as a cook, scientist, athlete or a gardener. God calls us to use all of our talents to serve God and others. But the Holy Spirit has also blessed us with spiritual gifts that are meant to be shared with others to bring maturity and unity in faith. As Christians, each one of us is a part of the body of Christ, and we have an important role to play in keeping the body healthy.

Like other presents, it is impossible to fully appreciate and make use of our spiritual gifts until they have been opened. This tool will help you begin to open your spiritual gifts by guiding you through the following activities:

- Explore scripture references that describe the spiritual gifts
- Take a 66-question (15 min.) self-assessment to help you identify which gifts you have received in greatest measure
- Read descriptions, general characteristics, and cautions about your gifts
- Learn about possible uses of your gifts through service opportunities at Nativity and elsewhere.



Scripture References

The Apostle Paul addresses spiritual gifts in: Romans 12, I Corinthians 12, and Ephesians 4. Peter advises Christians about them in I Peter 4. Through these and other sections of scripture, we learn that all Christians have been given at least one spiritual gift. The purpose of spiritual gifts is twofold: (1) to encourage one another in our relationship with God and (2) to make God's love manifest in the world. These gifts are to be used in service to God and one another. **Generally speaking, we do not choose which gifts we will receive.** God gives spiritual gifts to us through the work of the Holy Spirit. Not all of the gifts identified in scripture are included in this inventory.

Spiritual Gifts Assessment Scoring Grid

Note: Even though the term "scoring" is used, it is purely so that you can determine where your gifts are strongest. No other value is placed on the gifts you do or don't have. Remember, all gifts are given by the Holy Spirit.

Instructions: Total the rating numbers for the three questions in the column on the left. For each gift there is a set of three questions, which could have a potential score of 0 to 12. The rectangular blocks will total your score as you shade in the number 0 1 2 3 4 for each of the three questions. For example, in the category of Administration, the answers to the three questions equal the numbers 2+4+3, or 9. The bar will be shaded up to the number 9. Once the grid is complete, note that the longer the bar, the stronger the corresponding gift.
